How the Great Commission Inspired the Early Church

EXPONENTIAL GROWTH IN 3 WAYS:

- 1. # of believers
- 2. # of fellowships of believers
- 3. # of languages in which there were fellowships of believers

THE CHURCH'S FIRST MAJOR STRATEGIC ACCOMPLISHMENT:

The complete encirclement of the Mediterranean Sea with a 7,000-mile-long oval-shaped 'church belt'

How the GREAT COMMISSION became a Great Omission!

What the Church began substituting for obedience to the Great Commission—ASCETICISM, manifested by:

- a. Hermitting in caves
- b. The 'Stylite' movement
 - c. Trappist orders, etc.

A GLORIOUS OPPORTUNITY — MISSED!!



Results of that tragic substitution:

- a. Missionless creeds
 - b. The Dark Ages
 - c. The rise of Islam
- d. Empire building outpaced evangelism
 - e. Exponential growth ceased

THE TRAGIC CONSEQUENCE OF THE POST-APOSTOLIC GROWTH RATES

Church historian Rodney Stark, in *Cities of God*, reports that 1,000 believers shortly after Pentecost increased to 30 million by 350 A.D.—a growth rate of 3.4% per year! Had that growth rate continued, the # of Christians would have swelled to 1 billion Christians in just another 104 years! Instead, the growth rate of the Church slowed abysmally. Why?



CALVIN'S VIEW of the GREAT COMMISSION:

"We are taught [from Scripture] that the kingdom of Christ is neither to be advanced nor maintained by the industry of men, but this is the work of God alone."

GUSTAV WARNECK'S SUMMARY OF JOHN CALVIN'S LACK OF ZEAL FOR MISSIONS:

"...Calvin's exposition of the missionary commandment is silent regarding a missionary duty on the part of the Church. ... the command to go into all the world is spoken of [by Calvin] only in regard to the Apostles, not indeed in such a way as to exclude its application to subsequent generations, but yet without any such application."
